Eight 40 minute curricular lessons based around the *CBBC Operation Ouch! World War I Special* film suitable for 9-11 year olds.

SMSC

Spiritual: A readiness to challenge all that would constrain the human spirit e.g. moral neutrality or indifference, force, fanaticism, aggression, injustice, narrowness of vision, racism and other forms of discrimination.

Moral: An ability to distinguish right from wrong based on a knowledge of the moral codes of their own and other cultures and a confidence to act consistently in accordance with their own principles.

Social: Resolve conflicts and counter forces which militate against inclusion and unity.

Cultural: Develop the skills and attitudes to enable them to participate fully and positively in democratic modern Britain.

Lesson 3: PSHE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > First aid > Improvisation and making do 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > How to manage risk to physical, emotional health and wellbeing. > How to respond in an emergency.
Lesson 4: Physical Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Rob the trench and Bacteria ball 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Use running, jumping, throwing and catching in isolation and in combination. > Play competitive games, modified where appropriate and apply basic principles suitable for attacking and defending.
Lesson 5: Literacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Poetry 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Preparing poems and plays to read aloud and to perform, showing understanding through intonation, tone and volume so that the meaning is clear to an audience.
Lesson 6: Science	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Sound waves 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear. > Recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.
Lesson 7: Maths	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Mental arithmetic and bar charts 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why. > Complete, read and interpret information in tables, including timetables.
Lesson 8: Art	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Paper modelling and reflections 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > To improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including with drawing, painting and sculpture a range of materials.
